Born to a large culturally diverse family in the Eastern Cape in 1954, Trollip migrated to different regions around the country from a young age for better employment opportunities, eventually settling in KZN.

A diesel mechanic and workshop supervisor by profession, Trollip became a Christian pastor and a community and traditional Khoe-San leader.

While respectful of his Irish father's ancestry, Trollip has chosen to focus on the promotion and protection of the rights and culture of indigenous South Africans, the Khoe-San, his matri-centric mother's people.

Among others, Trollip serves on the Khoe-San Reference Group KZN (Chair) and national (member); District Land Reform Committee Uthugela (Chair) and national (member); National Khoe-San Working Group (executive member); Fraternal Pastors' Association KZN (Deputy Chair).

Trollip is fluent in English, Afrikaans, isiZulu and isiXhosa.

Trollip was an active anti-Apartheid movement member, and he remains passionate about land redistribution and restitution, and community development.
